

FY 2018-2021 TIP Amendment #5 - STAFF REPORT

Proposed Amendment #5 to the FY 2018-2021 Transportation Improvement Program as approved by the Transportation Improvement Program Committee is now presented to the Executive Committee for consideration.

1. Adds four projects to the FY 2018-2021 TIP at the request of the project sponsors. These projects do utilize TMACOG-managed funds. The projects are:
 - a. Metroparks – LUC Swan Creek Trail
 PID 107469 \$2,675,980 – CMAQ/Local – FY 2020 – CO
 - b. Metroparks – LUC Riverside Trail East
 PID 107480 \$1,309,078 – CMAQ/Local – FY 2020 – CO
 - c. Lucas County – LUC Dorr & McCord Roundabout
 PID 107483 \$2,388,482 – CMAQ/Local – FY 2021 – CO
 - d. City of Toledo – LUC Jefferson Cycle Track
 PID 107485 \$2,033,900 – CMAQ/Local – FY 2021 – CO

2. Modify two projects in the FY 2018-2021 TIP at the request of the project sponsors. These projects do utilize TMACOG-managed funds. The projects are:
 - a. Wood County – WOO CR 107 1.73 Oregon Rd
 PID 104428 \$2,720,408 – STBG/Safety/Local – FY 2021 CO
 The modification is adding \$1,000,000 of Safety Funding.
 - b. Lucas County – LUC Kilburn Road Bike Lanes
 PID 98999 \$44,000 – TA/Local – FY2018 PE
 \$216,000 – TA/Local – FY2019 RW
 The modification is adding the PE phase and moving the RW phase from FY2018 to FY2019.

TO THE FY 2018-2021 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM**

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of the Toledo Metropolitan Area Council of Governments is designated as the Metropolitan Planning Organization by the Governor of Ohio in cooperation with local elected officials and is authorized to carry out the continuing, comprehensive, and coordinated transportation planning process for the Toledo area; and

WHEREAS, the FY 2018-2021 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) was approved by the TMACOG Board of Trustees by Resolution No. 2017-09 on April 12, 2017; and amendments #1, #2, #3, and #4 were previously approved; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to add four projects and modify two projects in the local TIP; and

WHEREAS, the project modifications in this resolution were approved by Transportation Improvement Committee on January 22, 2018, and were approved by the Transportation Council on February 7, 2018; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOLEDO METROPOLITAN AREA COUNCIL OF GOVERNMENTS:

Section 4


